OUR MISSION:

To protect the human and civil rights of Hawaii's aging/disabled population who reside in licensed/certified long-term care settings through the provision of culturally sensitive advocacy



Functions of an Ombudsman



- Identify, investigate, and resolve complaints
- Protect health, safety, welfare, and rights of residents
- Inform residents/families about obtaining services by providers or outside agencies
- Provide technical support to Resident and Family Councils
- Ensure residents have "regular and timely access" to services (quarterly visits)
- Represent interests of residents before governmental agencies
- Analyze, comment on, and monitor the development and implementation of federal, state, and local laws, regulations and other governmental policies and actions

Levels of Care (LOC)



- Acute: Hospital
- Skilled: Nursing Home, CCFFH, Expanded ARCH or "Going Home Plus" (DHS)
- Intermediate Care: Nursing Home,
 CCFFH, Expanded ARCH
- Custodial: ARCH or Adult Day Care/Respite Care
- Assisted Living Combination
- Independent: Group home, boarding home, senior home, own home

Residents Rights

- A Facility MUST protect and promote the rights of each resident!!
- Dignified existence / Homelike Environment
- Self-determination
- Communication/access
- Exercise rights as a citizen of USA
- Free from interference, coercion, discrimination and reprisal
- Even if adjudicated incompetent, facility must respect the resident's wishes to the maximum extent practicable
- Facility must inform residents of their rights in writing and orally in a language resident understands
- Resident has right to access ALL records pertaining to him/herself and purchase copies








Concerning (LEGAL) trends and challenges

- Guardianship problems jamming up hospitals
 - OPG needs tweaking volunteers?
- Wahiawa NH canary in mineshaft? "Certificate of NO Need?"
- Home Health staff shortages can't discharge
- POA as weapon against siblings (Ann Pearl) DPOAHC NOT the same
- ESL residents labeled as difficult communication failure
- CMAs done by RNs instead of SWs a problem
- Facility SWs used as bouncers
 - Insurance providers practicing medicine without a license?
- Residents (FA) needing POAs but have NO ONE to ask

Concerning (LEGAL) trends and challenges

- AIPHs UNLICENSED and ILLEGAL go after referral source (MDs, RNs)
- COVID Pandemic ARCHs/CCFFHs needed more help. Not part of HAH or CMS
- LTC Insurance not consistently covering CCFFHs READ policy!
- RN professors needed to train LPNs virtual mentorship?
- Can condo kids be paid to care for condo kupuna?
- No place for seniors with serious mental health behaviors. Spouses stuck
 - Maui Memorial Police Dept beds needed for violent dementia spouses
- Can Medicaid pay for ALFs? ... other way around!
- COVID impact on staffing from Philippines and elsewhere?
- Use [zoom] technology to connect more teachers from anywhere in U.S. to more Hawaii students (RNs, CNAs, LPNs)
- CCFFHs reimbursement: \$1,442.90 + \$46.06/day = \$2,824.70/mo.
 - Same rate since 2006! Bankruptcy case -

Concerning (LEGAL) trends and challenges

- Illegal Discharges (hotels, IHS, boarding home, mother's house, YMCA) Livanta NFs have the power. Residents don't know their rights.
- Insurance determining discharge/treatment instead of doctor and medical staff (Luigi Mangione)
- Kaiser 18 minutes per patient visit!!
- Five Allowable Reasons for Discharge
- Where have all the pro bono attorneys gone?
- Can pro bono attorneys get paid by NF if they win case? Deterrent. Not in federal law and not in HRS
- Using Facebook/internet to attack NFs. HIPPA? Libel? Free speech?
- TM eviction from mom's home. Legal Aid contract.
- Notary law conflicts of interest?
- "Danger" to residents/staff ... really? Refusal to readmit after stabilized. Bounced from NF to acute to NF to acute!!
- Need staff to be PRO-Active: Can't sleep tossed water, verbal threats, wrapped cord around neck
- PNA HB960 \$50 > \$75/mo. started October 1st. DHS never notified NFs!



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
